

The number of candidates participating in the December 6 Republican Presidential Debate held in Tuscaloosa, Alabama, dwindled down to four, and they used the two-hour session to battle one another – attacking their opponents over U.S. foreign policy and on personalities.

Florida Governor Ron DeSantis, former U.N. Ambassador and South Carolina Governor Nikki Haley, former New Jersey Governor Chris Christie and biotech tycoon Vivek Ramaswamy participated.



DeSantis noted his strong 2022 re-election victory margin, and immediately attacked Haley as someone who "caves" under pressure, is "soft" on transgender issues, has become wealthy since leaving public service, and has "gone out of her

way" to cozy up to China to encourage investments. He also brought up some new policy proposals, such as his belief that student loans should be underwritten by colleges themselves. And asked whether former **President Donald Trump** is "mentally fit to serve" again, DeSantis said that Republicans need to elect a fresher face who can serve two terms. He also criticized Trump for not "cleaning up 'the swamp" and not having Mexico pay for a wall on the southern border.

Haley pushed back on comments about her wealth and said there was a need to "end all normal trade relations with China in response to the fentanyl epidemic." She also said it was "not worth my time" to respond to an attack from Ramaswamy, who held up a piece of paper on which he had written that "Nikki = corrupt." She added that he was "not a serious candidate." At the end of the debate, Haley told her rivals: "I love all of the attention, fellas, thank you for that." According to recent polls. She heads into the Iowa caucuses neck-and-neck with DeSantis for second place.

Ramaswamy also said the 2020 election "was indeed stolen, by big tech," while maintaining a hint of vagueness as to exactly what he meant. He accused his three debate opponents of "licking Trump's boots for years for money and endorsements" and said "the real enemy is not Donald Trump. It's not even Joe Biden. It's the Deep State that Trump at least attempted to take on." And he said that Christie ought to leave the debate stages and "get a nice meal and get out of this race."

In retaliation, Christie contended that Ramaswamy was "the most obnoxious blowhard in America." And speaking of Trump, who currently leads in public opinion polls but has elected not to participate in the debates, Christie said he was not "fit" to serve again and suggested that he did not have "the guts" to show up. And contending that DeSantis was guilty of "evasiveness" on the question of whether he would send U.S. troops to try to rescue hostages held by Hamas.

All four candidates said they would uphold the United States' commitment to defend Taiwan if China acts on its threat to invade the island nation.

The debate moderators were Megyn Kelly of Sirius XM, Elizabeth Vargas of NewsNation, and Eliana Johnson of the Washington Free Beacon.



One night before the debate, Trump participated in a one-on-one session on Fox News with host Sean Hannity and said that if re-elected, on his first day in office, he wanted to "close the border, and drill, drill, drill" for oil. "And probably on day two," he added, "we will get rid of this ridiculous electric car mandate."

On energy, he also claimed that U.S. Climate envoy John Kerry is laughed at by people "all over the world" as he ushes to get rid of coal plants.

Going into the upcoming 2024 Iowa Caucuses, Trump said he

had two big victories there when he ran in 2016 and 2020, and he expects this time to win by even more. He added that he plans to spend the weeks leading up to the caucus "blitzing" the state.

Asked about President Biden's "cognitive state" and concerns about his age and health as he runs for re-election, Trump suggested that the current



president, who is backed up by the media, "doesn't know he's alive," and "I don't think he can physically make it through another term."

Likening himself to the infamous gangster Al Capone, and talking about the slew of criminal indictments he currently faces, Trump – who has pled not guilty in all of them – said Capone was "one of the greatest of all time, if you like criminals. He was a mob boss who got indicted once. I got indicted four times. I wonder what my father and mother would say looking down."

FLORIDA, CALIFORNIA GOVERNORS' "NO HOLDS BARRED" RED-BLUE DEBATE

It was not an officially sanctioned political debate, but there were plenty of fireworks on the Fox News Channel on November 30 when moderator Sean Hannity hosted a 90-minute contest between **Florida Republican Governor Ron DeSantis** and his California Democrat counterpart Gavin Newsom.



Billed as a 90-minute "Great Red State Vs. Blue State" debate held outside Atlanta in Alpharetta, Georgia – with no audience in attendance – the two men stood in front of their respective red and blue backgrounds and clashed over issues including COVID-19, education, crime, LGBTQ rights, wokeness, immigration, and abortion. They constantly interrupted conversations, talking over one another, and each called the other "a bully."

DeSantis accused his counterpart of not lifting a finger to reign in George Gascon, Los Angeles' Soros-supported progressive prosecutor. And he held up a blotted map of San Francisco that he said showed how many incidents of human feces that been reported in the city. But, DeSantis added, "They cleaned it up when a communist dictator came to town to visit."

He also showed graphic images from woke children's books, saying it is in some of the schools in California, and calling it pornography, and said that Newsom's policies like COVID-19 restrictions have driven people out of California, making him "the first governor to ever lose population." Seeking to tie Newsom to the Biden-Harris administration, DeSantis called that agenda "on steroids."

A highpoint for DeSantis was to recall a conversation he said he had with a man who had recently fled to Florida from California, noting that his new state was safer, and had lower taxes and a better governor. That man, DeSantis said with a smile, was "Newsom's father-in-law."

Newsom called DeSantis' signing of a six-week abortion ban "too extreme," and said he did not like the way his opponent demeans the LGBTQ community. Referring to the Republican presidential primary race, he noted that the Floridian was lagging behind former President Trump by 40 points. He criticized DeSantis for retaliating against Disney for opposing his parental rights bill, saying "Ask the folks at Disney about freedom and free enterprise."

Newsom also called his opponent "a lockdown governor" and accused him of supporting amnesty for illegals, as well as giving Joe Biden an "A" grade for doing just fine as president. Defending "Bidenomics," he claimed that Biden has created 14 million jobs – ten times more than the last three Republican presidents combined. And he claimed that there were actually more Floridians moving to California than vice versa, which even the media debunked in the past. On the subject of violent crime, he skirted responsibility for his state's abysmal record by instead drawing attention to the 2018 Parkland High School mass shooting in Florida, which actually occurred one year before DeSantis took office.

What both governors -- who have had a long-running rivalry since early 2020 – have in common is that they're positioning themselves as the next generation of leadership for their respective parties.

DeSantis has much higher stakes as a Republican presidential candidate, and he positioned himself as the leader of a state nationally considered as a beacon to conservative policies, with low taxes, less gun restrictions and a focus on parental rights in education.

Newsom, although he has been widely considered to be a key 2028 Democrat presidential figure, staunchly defended California on the debate stage, and tied the conversation to the 2024 presidential race. He had the opportunity to boost his national image by showing he was unafraid of fighting for a Democratic platform, going into a debate moderated by a conservative talk show host on a right-wing network.

Hannity repeatedly said he wanted a "free-flowing – and at times raucous – debate, and that is what he got. After the 90-minute time frame, he asked the pair whether they wanted to continue for another half-hour, and both agreed. But he soon announced that was not happening.

A DeSantis source who was backstage, as well as other sources on the ground not affiliated with either campaign, said Newsom's wife, Jennifer Siebel Newsom, had walked onto the stage during the last commercial break, and ended the debate on behalf of her husband. But subsequently, Newsom advisers refuted that claim, contending that personnel affiliated with both governors reached a consensus on the decision.



POLITICAL JOTTINGS AND DOTTINGS

--The All-Democrat Colorado Supreme Court alleged by a 4-3 margin on December 16 that former President Donald Trump "engaged in insurrection"

on January 6, 2021 by inciting a crowd to storm the U.S. Capitol building, and ruled that he was disqualified to appear on the state's primary election ballot. The ruling – enforced by Justices Monica Marquez, William Hood, Richard Gabriel and Melissa Hart – was roundly criticized by political observers, constitutional academics, Republicans (including Trump's opponents), and even some Democrats. A ruling on the matter by the U.S. Supreme Court is expected shortly.

Meanwhile, on December 27, the Michigan Supreme Court -- in an unsigned order with no vote count being released -- announced it had rejected an attempt to remove Trump from its state's 2024 ballot.

--According to "The Washington Times," a survey conducted by the Heartland Institute and Rasmussen Reports has discovered that 21 percent of U.S. voters who used mail-in ballots – about 43 percent of the total votes cast in the United States in the 2020 presidential election – have admitted to committing voter fraud. They told the pollsters they filled out a ballot, in part or in full, for a friend or family member. Others said they voted in a state where they no longer lived permanently. These actions are illegal in all states, and if caught, those ballots would have been invalidated. "For the past three years, Americans have repeatedly been told that the 2020 election was the most secure in history. But if this poll's findings are reflective of reality, the exact opposite is true," said Justin Haskins, director of the Socialism Research Center at the Heartland Institute. "This conclusion isn't based on conspiracy theories or suspect evidence, but rather from the responses made directly by the voters themselves." -0-

--Republican events next month are the Iowa caucuses on January 15, and the New Hampshire Presidential Primary on January 23.

--The razor-thin Republican majority in the U.S. House of Representatives got even thinner on December 1, when more than two-thirds of the entire body voted to expel New York Republican Congressman George Santos, who is facing federal indictment on 23 counts of wire fraud, identity theft, other

campaign finance charges, and who fabricated his biography while on the campaign trail. Santos only served 11 months in office, and 105 Republicans joined nearly all of the House Democrats in s 311-114 expulsion vote. He becomes the sixth House member in history ever to be ousted – three during the Civil War for being disloyal to the Union, and two others for being convicted of crimes. While Santos is facing 23 criminal counts on allegations that he misled donors, fraudulently received unemployment benefits and charging his donors' credit cards without authorization, has pleaded not guilty to all charges and is set to go to trial in September 2024. More than a dozen candidates are already campaigning in New York to succeed him. There will be a special election called in Santos' toss-up district, probably early in 2024.

-After announcing his presidential bid as "a business leader and proven governor's voice to the fight for the best of America," **Republican North Dakota Governor Doug Burgum** said on December 4 he was suspending his campaign after failing to gain traction in the crowded field.

--In an interview with CBS, the "alleged Republican" Utah Senator, former Massachusetts Governor and unsuccessful Presidential candidate Willard "Mittens" Romney said that next year he will be happy to vote for a Democrat for President if he does not like the Republican nominee. Remember the role he played in the Trump impeachments. And to think we once campaigned for Mittens. Meanwhile, an unnamed writer at www.prudentpolitics.com said this remark threw the entire Republican Party into "chaos." According to the website, a spokesperson for the Trump campaign dismissed Romney's opinion as irrelevant, saying, "Voters aren't going to take advice from a loser and quitter like Mittens." Romney's own record is not exactly stellar. The website noted that he was a failed presidential candidate in 2012, and his time as governor was marked by high taxes and wasteful spending. He also is a flip-flopper who has changed his position on numerous issues, including abortion, same-sex marriage, and gun control. The website added that this sort of attitude is harmful to Republican candidates, and right now the Republican Party needs to be focused on defeating Joe Biden and saving America, but Romney does not seem to agree. -0-

--The Democrat Party of Florida has cancelled its presidential preference primary election scheduled for March 19, 2024, and approved only President Joe Biden as its candidate for reelection in November.

Some of you may remember the science fiction series, "The Outer Limits."

Recently I have been watching the series on a streaming service and came across an



episode entitled "O.B.I.T., Outer Band Individuated Teletracer" a mysterious electronic device that tunes in on the different wavelengths of the human body. No one knew who invented it nor how many have been replicated and distributed around the world.

The premise was that aliens had planted these devices so that they could manipulate the behavior of human beings. The climax has the alien exposed and he says: "The machines are everywhere. Oh, you'll find them all. And you'll make a great show of smashing a few of them, but for everyone you destroy, hundreds of others will be built. And they'll demoralize you, break your spirits, create such rips and such tensions in your society that no one will be able to repair them.... And when we come here to live.... you friendless, demoralized flotsam will fall without even a single shot being fired."

This episode is so prophetic that it is here. Alien technology being used by a foreign government, manipulating our society and leaders, Senate investigations, stonewalling, this episode had it all. O.B.I.T. is today better known as SOCIAL MEDIA.

Lately we have had Congress calling university presidents to testify as to the violent antisemitism being allowed on their campuses. They had been well coached by attorneys. Each of them mimicked the statement of Harvard president, Claudine Gay, "it depends on the context" of genocide, "From the River To The Sea" or as David Litman said "was unable or unwilling to state the obvious: Calls for the genocide of Jews should not be welcome on college campuses. Fortunately for Gay, the Harvard Corporation fellows turned out to be equally incapable of leadership and her job was saved."

The presidents of MIT, U Penn, Harvard, and many other universities have echoed the same sentiments. Some have retracted or amended their statements. Too little, too late. Some have been fired, some resigned but Harvard, even in the face of obvious plagiarism by Gay, decided to retain her as president.

Some Ivy League Universities have lost hundreds of thousands in donations. Harvard's inaction on Claudine Gay has cost them billions of dollars in donations.

Pew Research reports that young adults ages 18-29 are most likely to regularly get news from TikTok.

More of TikTok.... U.S. adult users are getting news there as well. 43% of TikTok users say they regularly get news on the site.



The latest reiteration of O.B.I.T. is BeReal. It is a French photo-sharing social media platform developed by Alexis Barreyat and Kevin Perreau and released in 2020. The app targets college students. Once a day the app notifies you that it's time to post your Be Real for the day. There are no filters and no explanations as to what the user is posting. Friends on the app are notified of the posting.

U.S. PIRG Education Fund found that 8 in 10 Americans get their news on digital devices – beating out TV, radio or print. 53% of Americans get at least some of their news from social media. Twitter, Facebook, and TikTok have all become pseudo-news platforms.

As the Outer Limits episode said, the machines are everywhere. Congress has been debating for years about how to control social media and has no answers. Pandora's Box has been opened. The genie is out of the bottle, and, at this point, there is no putting it back in.

MAYFIELD MINUTE By Florida District 19 State Senator Debbie Mayfield

Florida played a critical role in World War II as the federal government relied on our State's residents and resources. Historians have stated over 250,000 Floridians volunteered or were drafted into the military for World War II. New military bases were

established or expanded as non-Floridians migrated to the state by the tens of thousands. Many soldiers, sailors, marines, airmen, and nurses who trained or served in Florida later returned to the state as visitors or as new residents driving the state's economic rebound. This in-migration was reflected in a 46.1 percent increase in Florida's population from the 1940s to the 1950s.

DeSantis has released his 2024-25 \$114.4 billion "Focus on Florida's Future" budget recommendations. The highlights include: \$1.1 billion in tax breaks, with six sales-tax holidays to save residents on fall and spring Back-to-School supplies, two disaster preparedness holidays, a 3-month Freedom Summer sales tax exemption, and a 7-day Tool Time sales tax holiday; \$745 million for Everglades restoration efforts and \$157 million to brace against rising sea levels and to protect

coral reefs; \$14.5 billion for transportation projects with \$630 million for the second year of the \$7 billion "Moving Florida Forward" program affecting 20 projects across the state; \$109 million to replenish the My Safe Florida Home program to help residents make home improvements to reduce insurance premiums; \$87 million to upgrade correctional facilities and \$100 million to harden the state's cybersecurity framework; \$57 million for the Florida State Guard and \$157 million for the second year of upgrades at Camp Blanding; \$27.8 billion for public schools and voucher programs and a \$200 million increase for teacher pay; and \$6 million for the Alzheimer's Disease Initiative and \$15 million for increased community care and home care for the elderly.

In preparation for the opening of the 2024 Florida State Legislature, Senate Committees have been working on proposed bills, including Bill 196, to remove burdensome restrictions on regional economic development organizations and increase access to rural development funding; Bill 226, to urge the U.S. Congress to expand the Florida National Guard's Force Allocation; and Bill 66, to create "Victoria's Law" to raise awareness of the dangers of opioid addiction and the availability of medical treatments to reverse the effects of opioid overdose.

The state of Florida recently announced it is holding unclaimed property totaling over \$2.9 billion. Unclaimed property is defined as a financial asset that is unknown or lost, or has been left inactive, unclaimed, or abandoned by its owner. Examples include Dormant bank accounts; Unclaimed insurance proceeds, stocks, and dividends; Uncashed checks, deposits, credit balances, and refunds; and Contents from abandoned safe deposit boxes in financial institutions.

Unclaimed property assets are held by business or government entities for a set period of time, usually five years. If the holder is unable to locate, re-establish contact with the owner and return the asset, it is reported and remitted to the Florida Department of Financial Services, Division of Unclaimed Property.

The business rent tax (BRT) imposed on Florida businesses renting or leasing commercial property was reduced from 5.5 to 4.5 percent on December 1. The one percent reduction represents \$216 million in savings for business owners. Florida ranks as one of the most business-friendly climates in the nation, yet the burden of the BRT has left many small and midsized businesses at a competitive disadvantage.

The Florida Chamber of Commerce has been at the forefront in advocacy against the BRT over the last six years. In 2021, Senate Bill 50 passed and was signed into law by Governor DeSantis. SB 50 will reduce the BRT to two percent after the unemployment trust fund is replenished to pre-pandemic levels. -0-

Florida Attorney General Ashley Moody has reminded parents to protect children online by monitoring their activities on mobile phones and implementing parental control measures. She said 95 percent of teenagers have a smartphone, as do 43 percent of children ages 8-12. Online predators and traffickers, Moody added, use mobile apps and social media to target children. She is offering online safety tips for parents to protect children from digital drug dealers, sexual predators and human traffickers.

The 2023 Atlantic Hurricane Season ended on November 30 and while the season produced 20 named storms, only one significantly impacted Florida. Hurricane Idalia, a strong Category 3 storm made landfall on the Big Bend Gulf coast near Keaton Beach in Taylor County on August 30. The storm caused flooding, downed power lines, and over \$447 million in agricultural losses.

Much of the state was fortunate this hurricane season but it is always prudent to be well prepared before, during, and after a catastrophe.

The 2023 sea turtle nesting season (March 1st thru October 31) in Indian River County has set a new record with 12,771 nests, easily surpassing the 2022 count of 9,242 nests.

The annual nesting season is comprised of three distinct sea turtle species, leatherbacks, loggerheads, and green sea turtles. Experts report each turtle can lay up to six nests per season with each nest holding 80-120 eggs.

In 2023, loggerhead sea turtles, the most common in the area, created 8,639 nests, a 15 percent increase from last year; green sea turtles, known for consuming seagrass, have increased by 55 percent from their previous record in 2017, laying 4,105 nests; and leatherback sea turtles, the largest species, have laid 27 nests, a decrease from the 101 nests in 2022.

Conservation efforts are critical to support the sea turtles' long migrations which can span thousands of miles before returning to their birth beaches for nesting. Experts confirm that it can take 20-30 years for a turtle to mature enough for egg-laying.

In December, the Florida Legislature successfully completed our final two Interim Committee Weeks before the start of the 2024 Legislative Session on January 9. RENDEZVOUS WITH REPUBLICAN WOMEN

The Brevard Federated Republican Women's December 6 lunch meeting featured

Brevard County Public Defender Blaise Trettis as guest speaker, whose topic was "The Political Persecution of President Donald J. Trump."

Trettis explained the Court cases pending against Trump, saying the fraud civil case brought by New York's Attorney General Letitia James is a political prosecution; she ran for and won office on the promise to get Trump. "The job of a prosecutor is not to get anybody," he said, "the job is to do justice."



James' case is based on the argument that Trump overstated the value of his properties in order to get favorable loan rates and the judge has agreed. Trettis believes that's an issue between the banks and the President and that no bank has complained and the loans all paid back. The trial is now in its penalty phase, and James is reportedly seeking \$250 million in penalties and a ban on Trump doing business in New York. If the judge's ruling is upheld, Trump and his company will be forced to pay a fine and sell properties in New York, including Trump Tower, a suburban estate, golf courses and a Wall Street office building. Trettis believes that James has weaponized our legal system for ideological and partisan purposes and, in doing so, threatens to destroy our legal system.

The NY falsifying records case, he said, is a "ridiculous" criminal action against Trump in Manhattan. He has been indicted by Democratic Manhattan District Attorney Alvin Bragg for allegedly falsifying business records after a grand jury probe into alleged hush money paid to porn star Stormy Daniels. Trettis believes these charges are political. The crime charged is a misdemeanor, and even if true, Trump cannot be convicted because the two-year statute of limitations expired long ago. Trettis said that the charges are shocking, blatant punishment for Trump daring to seek reelection.

The Georgia RICO case, Trettis said, brought by Fulton County Georgia District Attorney Fani Willis, alleges that Trump violated Georgia's RICO Act, which is based on a

federal law designed to take down the Mob, for questioning the legitimacy of the outcome of the 2020 election in Georgia. Trettis said that Willis also brought the same charges against 18 of Trump supporters and lawyers, and that she is criminalizing the practice of law in support of Republicans.

Trettis also said that House Judiciary Committee Chairman Jim Jordan has initiated an inquiry into the alleged collusion between Fani Willis and the partisan January 6 Select Committee to determine whether the politically motivated prosecutions are relying on records obtained from the January 6 Select Committee. He said that collusion between Willis and the Select Committee would be a violation of Trump's due process rights and Willis' obligation as a Prosecutor to disclose all materials relied upon in prosecuting him. He also said that Jordan may expose collusion between Prosecutor Willis, federal officials and the Select Committee.

The classified documents case is based on the FBI's raid on Trump's Mar-a-Lago estate. The Justice Department alleges that President Trump violated the law by taking classified official Presidential records from the White House. Trettis said that there is a double standard and, since classified documents from Vice President Biden's office were found at his office and home, the charges against Trump must be politically motivated. Trettis added that Trump has had some modest success in this case; U.S. District Judge Aileen Cannon has pushed back several deadlines for filing and responding to pretrial motions, giving Trump's lawyers more time to prepare his defense.

The election interference case, the federal election interference case, alleges that Trump conspired to obstruct the certification of the 2020 election. The case set for trial in Washington accuses Trump of disrupting the peaceful transfer of power by urging his supporters to seize control of the U.S. Capitol on January 6, 2021. Trump has argued that he is immune from prosecution because the speech the charges are based on was made in carrying out his Presidential duties.

Trettis also said that U.S. District Judge Tanya Chutkan, presiding over this case, is a far-left Obama appointee known for handing down sentences to January 6 defendants that are longer than requested by the Justice Department. In October 2022, Chutkan, referring to January 6, said "and the people who mobbed that Capitol were there in fealty, in loyalty, to one man...it's a blind loyalty to one person who, by the way, remains free to this day." Chutkan has denied Trump's request that she remove herself from the case for bias.

The "Keep Trump off the ballot" cases arguing that Section 3 of the U.S. Constitution's 14th Amendment disqualifies him from running for President in 2024 are pending around the country. Trettis said that Trump is winning these cases, but that does not stop Democrats from politicalizing and weaponizing the justice system to get Trump by forcing him to spend time and money defending himself; it's political persecution and election Interference at the highest level in history.

"This is not a one-off thing, it is the way Democrats systemically abuse our system to seize and hold power," Trettis concluded, "and it is important that American people know what is going on. We have seen Attorney General Merrick Garland's two-tiered justice system and Biden and his team's politically motivated, coordinated investigations and prosecution of President Trump. Democracy cannot survive under a politicalized partisan, two-tier justice system."

The next meeting of the Brevard Republican Executive Committee will be on Wednesday, January 3, 2024.

HENRY KISSINGER. The most powerful U.S. diplomat of the Cold War era, who helped Washington open up China, forge arms control deals with the Soviet Union, end the Vietnam War, and authored several books – Henry Kissinger -- died at his Connecticut home on November 29, six months after his 100th birthday. Born in Germany, he immigrated with

his family to the United States when the Nazis took over the country. He is survived by his wife, Nancy, and children Elizabeth and David. Kissinger became a naturalized U.S. citizen in 1943, served in the Army in Europe in World War Two, and attended Harvard University on a scholarship, where he earned a doctorate in 1954 and stayed on the faculty for the next 17 years. He also served as U.S. Secretary of State to Presidents Richard Nixon and Gerald Ford. Conducting negotiations to settle the Vietnam War, he shared in receiving the Nobel Peace Prize. He also conducted negotiations between Egypt and Israel amid the 1973 war. In addition to his Nobel award, Kissinger received the country's highest civilian award – the Presidential Medal of Freedom. He also was appointed by President Ronald Reagan to chair the National Bipartisan Commission on Central America, and later served under Reagan and President George H.W. Bush on the President's Foreign Intelligence Advisory Board... (Personal note: Your Editor had his own "association" with Kissinger, in 1973 and 1974, while serving as Assistant Information Officer at the U.S. Embassy in Islamabad, Pakistan. That first year, we received word that Secretary of State Kissinger and his entourage would be stopping overnight in Islamabad on a classified mission – which turned out to be his secret first visit to China. It was "all hands-on deck" for the visit, where the Secretary would meet with highranking U.S. and Pakistani leaders. For my editorial team and me, it was an all-nighter, collecting early editions of Pakistani newspapers, translating articles from Urdu to English, and preparing a scrap book of Kissinger's visit to present upon his morning departure. One year later, the Secretary returned on exactly the same date, and while by this time his China visit was no longer secret, the activities remained the same. Both times, it meant that all of the foreign service officers and their staff again pulled an all-nighter. Unfortunately, for the officers' wives, it meant that the following night – both years - the husbands were exhausted. And as fate would have it, on both times, the next evening was the night of the annual Marine Corps Ball - the ONLY formal event of the year in Pakistan – and something that the wives had looked forward to. But of course, the job came first. And I am pleased to have in my book collection a copy of Kissinger's first tome, "White House Years," that he signed to me personally.) **REMEMBERING SANDRA DAY O'CONNOR.** The first woman to serve on the U.S. Supreme Court, Arizona's Sandra Day O'Connor, died in Phoenix on December 1 of

complications related to advanced dementia, Alzheimer's disease, and a respiratory illness. She was 93. President Ronald Reagan appointed her to the court in 1981, and she served until her retirement in 2006. Chief Justice John Roberts said this "Daughter of the American Southwest blazed an historic trail. She met the challenge with undaunted determination,



indisputable ability, and engaging candor. We at the Supreme Court mourn the loss of a beloved colleague, a fiercely independent defender of the rule of law, and an eloquent advocate for civics education. We celebrate her enduring legacy as a true public servant and patriot." O'Connor was a moderately conservative jurist, who voted predominantly with the conservative majority of the bench, however, she was also independent in her decisions and dissenting arguments. Throughout her career, she provided key votes in several consequential cases, such as "Planned Parenthood v. Casey" in 1992, which upheld abortion at the time; and "Bush v Gore" in 2000, which reversed a Florida Supreme Court Ruling and giving George W. Bush presidential election victory over former Vice President Al Gore. Stepping away from public life in 2018, O'Connor wrote that "While the final chapter of my life with dementia may be trying, nothing has diminished my gratitude and deep appreciation for the countless blessings in my life. How fortunate I feel to be an American and to have been presented with the remarkable opportunities available to the citizens of our country. As a young cowgirl from the Arizona desert, I never could have imagined that one day I would become the first woman justice on the U.S. Supreme Court." She is survived by her three adult sons – Scott, Brian, and Jay - and was preceded in death by her late husband John, who also died from complications of Alzheimer's disease in 2009.

RESEARCH GRANT TRANSPARENCY. Noting that



more disclosure is needed of foreign involvement from countries of concern in taxpayer-funded research grants, Florida Congressman Bill Posey has introduced legislation in the House of Representatives for the GRANT ACT (Grant Recipient Accountability for Necessary Transparency Act). "It's common for foreign researchers from countries like

China to join a taxpayer funded research project after the grant was applied for and awarded, allowing foreign researchers to influence or take taxpayer funded research back to their home countries without the proper oversight," Posey said. "This bill

allows for more accountability of taxpayer dollars and the research it's used to fund." A recent EPA Inspector General memorandum identified "a concern regarding the lack of a requirement for EPA research grant recipients to report foreign support after receiving a grant award." The memo discusses a collaborative effort involving federal law enforcement and other government agencies to see if unreported foreign gifts could be linked to federally funded awards. They found six universities received awards in the amount of \$1.3 billion from foreign sources (including China, Qatar, and Russia) over the past seven years and did not report them as required. The proposed GRANT Act requires the disclosure of foreign support from countries of concern no later than 30 days after the date it was received. Covered individuals (professors, researchers, investigators, etc.) must also disclose support as well. The agency also must cooperate with the Inspector General investigating any suspected failure to comply with the requirements. The bill defines countries of foreign concern includes the People's Republic of China including Hong Kong, Russian Federation, Iran, North Korea, Cuba, and Venezuela.

Addressing the Heritage Isle Republican Club on December 7, **Bob White**, chairman of the Republican Liberty

Caucus of Florida, told the members that the two greatest aspects that we gained from Western Civilization have been the creation of the city- state and Judea-Christian culture. But the Left, he said, is attempting to undermine these gains through its Woke and ESG (Environmental, Social, and Governance)



movements. And what is "truly frightening," he said, are the massive numbers of illegals entering the country from all over the world. But what it does do, is foster its members to be party leaders committed to working within their local Republican Party organizations to invigorate and revitalize the GOP at every level. Candidates for local and state political office who seek RLC's endorsement have to fill out a lengthy questionnaire and also sign a pledge to adhere to the principles of the Liberty Compact. It reads: "I pledge to the citizens of this State and to the American people, that I will work to: restore liberty, not restrict it; shrink government, not expand it; reduce taxes, not raise them; abolish programs, not create them; promote the freedom and independence of citizens, not the interference of government in their lives; and observe the limited, enumerated powers of our Constitution, not ignore them." The plan to restore the Republic, White said, runs through the state capitals. RLC Florida, he added, gets involved every year in Tallahassee with the Florida State Legislature, which every session has had 2-3,000 bills introduced. Only a few hundred get approved each session, and RLC maintains a tracker on its website, listing the bills' status and whether they are marked for approval or opposition. Early in each session White and several dozen other RLC members travel to Tallahassee for two days of meetings with the legislators and discussion of proposed bills. White noted that the upcoming 60-day session begins January 9, and the Liberty Lobby Day meetings will be January 16-17. After each yearly session, he said, RLC carries a scorecard on how each legislative member votes on the issues before them. --After Washington State Democrat Congresswoman Pramila Jayapal, the chair of the Progressive Caucus in the House, was asked in a TV interview about alleged silence over brutal and deadly Hamas rapes of Israeli women, she did condemn the sexual violence, but added that Israel has killed 15,000 Palestinians – two-thirds of whom were women and children – action that "has not been complying with international humanitarian law." Both Democrats and Republicans then criticized Jayapal for her "balanced criticism," comparing Israel's war retaliation to the Hamas acts.

--Police did not release her name, but they arrested a 62-yearold woman in Genoa Township, Michigan, for actually attempting to shoplift more than \$700 worth of merchandise from a Walmart -- while more than 75 officers were inside the store at the time for a "Shop With A Cop" charity event. -0-

--Jeff Gray, an activist who travels among cities promoting the message "God Bless the Homeless Vets," was arrested in Port Wentworth, Georgia, when city officials order the police to do so, claiming that his comments on public sidewalks in front of City Hall were on "private property." But with the help of the Foundation for Individual Rights and Expression (FIRE), Gray's lawsuit against the city for censoring his First Amendment rights, resulted in an apology to him, and settlements of \$1,791 to the National Coalition for Homeless Veterans, to Gray, and to FIRE. The city also will maintain the public space in front of City Hall as an open public forum and train its officers on citizens' First Amendment rights.

--When the White House released its national strategy to counter antisemitism, it included a list of organizations to help implement the strategy. Surprisingly, the list included the Council on American-Islamic Relations (CAIR), which has a long history of antisemitism that the White House first tried to ignore, even though it received plenty of warnings. But then came Hamas' October 7 attacks, for which CAIR blamed Israel, so the White House finally "removed" their commitment to the initiative.

--Even though a national ranking of 248 U.S. colleges recently placed Harvard University at the very bottom of the list – zero – of those allowing "free speech" on campuses, the school's president – Claudine Gay – presented a different picture to the Congressional committee investigating campus antisemitism in the wake of Hamas' attack against Israel. He had been kept in the closet for three years before dying and suffered from malnourishment and food deprivation. During a 2019 hearing, the mother claimed her son was "pure

evil," and she had removed him from school, telling everyone she had "sent him to Mexico to a special school."

Venezuela now disputes the agreement and is using the referendum as an excuse to distract the population from its misery and to gain control over billions of oil barrels developed by the American Exxon Mobil oil company. Venezuela is ruled by socialist, anti-American autocrat Nicolas Maduro. He succeeded Marxist anti-American autocrat Hugo Chavez, who ruled from 1999 until his death from cancer in 2013. The combined years of their socialist rule have impoverished once prosperous Venezuela, even though it has the largest oil reserves in the world. An estimated 7.3 million Venezuelans have fled the country since 2014 due to rampant crime, inflation, political repression, and shortages of food, medicine, electricity, and employment opportunities. Two thousand flee every day, with an estimated 500,000 now living in the United States. China, along with Russia and Iran, prop up the Marxist Maduro regime. China alone has lent Venezuela over \$60 billion, backed by oil sales. Venezuela is China's fourth largest source of petroleum products.... The Chinese Communist Party's technologies of national digital ID cards, fingerprint authentication, and facial recognition cameras to track and suppress its citizens are now used in Venezuela. Every Venezuelan citizen is issued a Homeland Card with a unique OR code that contains identity, biographical information, and social credit information. The cards are used for social control and election influence and are critical for the regime's survival. In September 2023, Maduro visited China and signed bilateral cooperation agreements. This was followed by China upgrading relations to an "all-weather strategic partnership." The meeting is eerily similar to Putin's visit to China just before the Ukraine invasion, where Putin and Xi signed a "limitless"

partnership agreement. Guyana is a small country with a population of less than one million. Forty percent are of Indian heritage, and thirty percent are of African heritage. The remaining thirty percent is divided among people of indigenous and European heritage. It is the only English-speaking nation in South America. The Esequiba region, which

Venezuela claims, is the size of Florida and is two-thirds of Guyana's land mass. It is sparsely populated, primarily with indigenous people. Exxon and its partners, Hess and CNOOC (China National Offshore Oil Corporation), have discovered over 11 billion barrels of oil and gas offshore in Guyana. It is the largest new oil field in the world. The infusion of wealth into this small country is causing social friction and cries of environmental degradation."
