TRUMP SCORES VICTORIES IN NEW HAMPSHIRE PRIMARY, IOWA CAUCUSES

Only two declared candidates remained in the Republican Presidential race on January 23, and former **President Donald Trump** defeated former **South Carolina Governor Nikki Haley** in the nation's first primary election, held in New Hampshire – one in which Independents were eligible to participate, and many of them voted for Haley or a number of other names.



With 92 percent of the state's precincts reporting, Trump won 55 percent of the votes cast, while Haley won 42 percent.

Even though she finished second in the race, Haley said she had a "great night" and will continue to fight for the nomination. In response, Trump said Haley was "doing a speech like she won, but she didn't win," and added, "let's not have somebody take a victory when she had a very bad night." Two days before the event, **Florida Governor Ron DeSantis** announced he was dropping out of the presidential race and supporting Trump's re-election. "I can't ask our supporters to volunteer their time and donate their resources if we don't have a clear path to victory," he said.

ABC originally planned to run pre-primary debates with the presidential candidates, but when Haley said she would not participate, and DeSantis had already suspended his campaign, they were cancelled.

On January 15, Trump easily won the 2024 Iowa Caucuses, capturing 98 of the state's 99 counties. His 51 percent of the total votes cast statewide gave him a 30-point margin over DeSantis, the second place finisher, and Haley, who in third place, did win one county.

Businessman Vivek Ramaswamy's fourth-place finish in Iowa, with 7.7 percent of the vote, resulted in his dropping out of the race and announcing his support for Trump. Also listed on the ballot were former New Jersey Governor Chris Christie, who announced suspension of his campaign earlier; former Arkansas Governor Asa Hutchinson; businessman and pastor Ryan Binkley; and "other."

Turnout at hundreds of locations in Iowa for the caucus were lower than in past election cycles due to the extreme winter weather in the state. Still, more than 110,000 Iowans participated. And the race was such a blowout that even the left-leaning networks called the race for Trump minutes after the caucus began and only a few hundred votes were in.

After Trump was declared the winner, he met with his cheering supporters in Des Moines, and in a departure from his earlier attacks, congratulated his top three challengers for their good performances, adding that "It was time for Americans of all political stripes to come together." Trump also called President Joe Biden the "worst president ever," and stressed his regular speech remarks – pledging to seal up the border and stop an invasion of immigrants on the southern border; straighten out elections; and harness "liquid gold" for U.S. energy.

Hutchinson also announced following the caucus that he, too, was suspending his presidential campaign.

Prior to the Iowa Caucus, Fox News anchors Bret Baier and Martha MacCallum held three town hall meetings on the network, with candidates taking questions from Iowa voters.

On January 8, Haley attacked President Biden for criticizing her earlier comments about the Civil War during a speech in Charleston, saying that "Mother Emanuel Church is a sacred place. For Biden to show up there and give a political speech is offensive in itself. I don't need someone who palled around with segregationists in the '70s and has said racist comments all the way through his career lecturing me or anyone in South Carolina about what it is to have racism, slavery, or anything related to the Civil War."

Haley also repeatedly accused DeSantis of "lying because he's losing" and said President Trump "copped out" on U.S. international alliances and brought turmoil with his presidency. "Chaos follows him, and we cannot be a country in disarray," she said.

On other issues, Haley promised to negotiate a compromise on abortion, bolster U.S. support for Ukraine, and raise the retirement age to stave off insolvency for Social Security and Medicare.

The next evening, on January 9. DeSantis vowed that "we're going to do well here" in the Iowa caucus and emphasized that the battle for the Republican presidential nomination "is a long process."

Trump had his town hall session on January 10. Polling as the indisputable front-runner, he walked onstage to cheers and chants of "USA," remained to sign autographs and smiled as a questioner enthused "love you" as he listened to her question during the live telecast. Iowa voters and the co-moderators alternated asking Trump questions about pressing issues to the American people including the economy, abortion and foreign wars.

When asked how he would de-escalate global tensions, Trump said he would "do it through peace through strength." He also blamed President Biden's "weak" presidency for Russia's attack on Ukraine and the Hamas invasions of Israel.

The former president said the southern border is "not sustainable for our country," when asked how he would handle the influx of illegal migrants already in America. "We are going to have the largest deportation effort in the history of our country," he said. "We're bringing everybody back to where they came from. We have no choice. We have no choice." Trump also accused Haley and DeSantis of wanting to cut Medicare and Social Security as part of their plans to reduce the record national debt facing the nation.

At the same time as the Trump townhall on Fox News, CNN carried a debate between DeSantis and Haley, with neither candidate holding back – repeatedly denigrating each other as liars. She called him "desperate," and he said she was "mealy mouthed" and looked down on Middle America.

Noting that Florida is facing "affordability" problems, Haley said the U.S. should not try to replicate its policies, and that the Disney Corporation has been "woke" for a long time, and DeSantis only got "thin skin" when the company criticized him. DeSantis, in turn, accused Haley of being beholden to corporate interests and liberal politicians.

FLORIDA GOVERNOR RON DESANTIS DELIVERS STATE OF THE STATE ADDRESS

Speaking in Tallahassee at the opening of the Florida State Legislative Session on January 9, Florida Governor Ron DeSantis said in his 2024 State of the State Address that while "we are in the midst of a great upheaval throughout the nation," his message for Florida is simple: "Stay the course. The state of our state is strong. Let's keep doing what works. Let's continue to make Florida the envy of the nation."



Florida has "chosen well," he said. "We have chosen Facts over fear; Education over indoctrination; Law and Order over rioting and disorder; Fiscal responsibility over debt and profligacy. Our choices, DeSantis added, "have produced results that are second to none. #1 in

education freedom; #1 for parental involvement in education; #1 for talent development; #1 for higher education; #1 for net domestic in-migration for the third consecutive year; #1 in new business formation; #1 in GDP growth among large states, and better than most countries in the world; and #1 for entrepreneurship."

He also criticized President Joe Biden on immigration, drug overdoses, federal debt and border security, and tore into blue states and cities over crime, homelessness and spending. He again called Florida a "refuge for freedom and sanity."

Following are excerpts of the State of the State remarks:

(Begin Excerpts)

Florida now has millions more residents than New York, yet New York's budget is twice the size of Florida's. They have a \$4.3 billion budget deficit. Florida now has more manufacturing jobs than New York and added twice as many jobs as New York in the past year, and our unemployment rate is 1.4 percentage points lower.

It is not surprising that we have witnessed – and continue to witness – a great migration of Americans away from cities and states pursuing these failed policies, with Florida serving as a refuge for freedom and sanity.

The failures are not a result of chance, but of choices made by elected officials to put ideology over sound policy.....

We lead the nation in school choice. Last session, under the leadership of Speaker Renner, we enacted the largest expansion of school choice in American history. Florida has close to 1.5 million students enrolled full-time in various choice programs – from private scholarships to charter schools to choose options within school districts....

School systems are important, but they exist to serve the students, parents and the community, not to supersede the rights of parents to direct the education and upbringing of their children. We were one of the first states to enact a Parents' Bill of Rights and curriculum transparency.

We protected women's sports – as the father of two daughters I think it is important that they have the opportunity to compete with fairness and integrity. We protected our children from indoctrination and sexualized curriculum, and we stood up for parents against the woke mob. Over the past four years, we have invested a record three billion dollars to raise teacher pay. My budget proposal for this year includes another \$1.25 billion for even more pay increases....

On October 7th, Israel suffered one of the worst terrorist attacks in modern history. We knew the effects would reverberate here in Florida. Many Floridians were stranded in Israel after the war broke out and were not receiving adequate assistance from the US embassy or the State Department, so we stepped up by organizing evacuation flights to bring Floridians home....

But we didn't stop there. With your help, we called a Special Session of the Legislature at the first opportunity to pass expanded sanctions on Iran - who were clearly behind the heinous attacks. As threats of violence continued here at home, we stood up to protect our Jewish Day Schools, synagogues and Jewish students on university campuses.... The pro-Hamas activities and rampant antisemitism on college campuses exposed the intellectual rot that has developed on so many college campuses. In Florida, our universities must be dedicated to the pursuit of truth, the promotion of academic rigor and integrity, and the preparation of students to be citizens of our republic. We reject the modern trend of universities that subordinate high academic standards in favor of promoting an ideological agenda. To this end, we have eliminated so-called DEI from our public universities. DEI is a highly-ideological agenda – in practice it stands for discrimination, exclusion, and indoctrination - and it has no place in our public universities....

The recklessness of spending, borrowing and printing of money over the past four years by the federal government has driven up the costs of everything from groceries to housing – and has saddled Americans with high interest rates. The national debt now stands at \$34 trillion dollars. In NYC, there is a famous debt clock that shows the national debt going up in real time. I'd like to see one of those made for Florida's debt – only a Florida debt clock would be counting down, not up, because we have paid down nearly 25% of our state's debt over the past five years....

This year, my budget proposal reduces the budget by \$4 billion from the previous year, placing \$16.3 billion in reserves and paying down another \$455 million in state debt ahead of schedule. We have run budget surpluses and paid down debt while also enacting record-setting tax reductions, and even with these tax savings given to our residents, we have brought in \$1.3 billion over projections since the start of the fiscal year....

We have made it tax free to raise a child in Florida by permanently removing taxes on baby items – cribs, strollers, diapers, baby wipes, clothing, and children's shoes, among other items. We also provided relief for Florida commuters. The Toll Relief Program reduced commuter costs by \$470 million, helping nearly 1.2 million Floridians save as much as \$400 each....

Our policies to support law enforcement officers, eliminate riots, keep criminals off the streets, and remove lawless prosecutors from office have kept Florida at a 50-year crime low and have brought new law enforcement recruits to Florida from all 50 states.....

Thanks to the leadership of President Passidomo through the Live Local Act and record housing funding, countless police officers (as well as other staples of the community like teachers and nurses) will now be able to live in the communities they serve....

Last year, hundreds of Floridians had their homes destroyed or rendered uninhabitable by Hurricane Idalia. We rallied resources to the Big Bend region before, during, and after this powerful Category 3 storm made landfall.

At my direction nearly 30,000 utility linemen were staged in preparation for the storm, and among the thousands of first responders and National Guard who prepared to respond, there were members of our newly reformed Florida State Guard that deployed for the first time since 1947.

As a result of our preparations, in less than one week, ninetysix percent of power was restored, a record for such a rural part of the state....

Here in the Sunshine State, we have delivered good government that protects liberty and maintains order. We have won the unprecedented backing of a populace reflective of our country at large. And we have put forth a blueprint for America's revival that has instilled hope into the hearts of millions that a new birth of freedom can emanate from this land once more.

We are the heirs to the spirit of 1776 represented by the Liberty Bell. Over the next two months let's enact policies that Focus on Florida's Future, and that keep faith with our nation's founding ideals.

Together, we will keep Florida free and provide hope for a revival of the American spirit throughout these United States.

--After struggling to see gains in polling, former New Jersey Governor Chris Christie announced on January 10 that he is ending his 2024 presidential bid, saying "It's clear to me

tonight that there isn't a path for me to win the nomination.: Bur to inject drama into his remarks, he added, "I am going to make sure that in no way do I enable Donald Trump to ever be president of the United States again." Christie's departure was soon followed by those of North Dakota Governor Doug Burgum, businessman Vivek Ramaswamy, former Arkansas Governor Asa Hutchinson, and most recently – Florida Governor Ron DeSantis. -0-

--When an Iowa voter asked former South Carolina Governor and presidential hopeful Nikki Haley whether or not a man could become a woman, rather than answer with a simple "no" – as her rival DeSantis, has said – she blurted out instead: "After the age of 18, we want to make sure people can live any way they want to live. I don't think government needs to be in control of anybody's life. You go live the way you want to live; you should be free to live the way you want to live. And government and everybody else should stay out of your way."

--February's election calendar includes: February 8 – Nevada and Virgin Islands caucuses; February 24: South Carolina primary; and February 27: Michigan primary. -0-

--The Republicans' slim majority in the House of Representatives dwindled down to just two seats on January 21, when Ohio 6th District Congressman Bill Johnson resigned his seat to take the new position of president of Youngstown State University. To fill the seat for the rest of the calendar year, a special primary will take place on March 19, followed by the general election on June 11. -0-

--The Florida Republican Party on January 8 ousted its chairman, Christian Ziegler, saying his leadership became untenable after a woman who accused him of rape also said she previously had a consensual three-way sexual encounter with both Ziegler and his wife, Bridget. Ziegler denied the rape accusation and has not been criminally charged, but the situation was viewed as a drag on the party in a presidential election year. Vice Chairman Evan Power was elevated to the chairman's position. -0-

--California Federal District Judge David Carter, who was appointed to his post by former President Bill Clinton, ruled on January 3 to dismiss "with prejudice" a lawsuit that sought to keep former President Donald Trump off the 2024 Republican primary ballot in the Golden State. I find it amusing how the administration is pushing Electric Vehicles down our throats and being largely unsuccessful.

They use climate change and the need to move away from fossil fuel.



Recently, the nation has been under freeze warnings even here in Georgia. One story that caught my eye was a statement by one EV owner who said, "We got a bunch of dead robots out here,". The problem, Electric Vehicles take longer to charge in cold weather and their efficiency is drastically

lower than in warm climates.

Fox called the charging lots "car graveyards," describing the abandoned cars left in the lot after cars wouldn't charge. Tesla driver Brandon Welbourne told CBS2 that multiple cars had been towed from an Evergreen Park charging station.

A study by Just Energy, a retail energy provider specializing in electricity and natural gas commodities, found that charging stations are powered by whatever the power grid

runs on, which might include oil, coal, and natural gas. They stated that ".... researchers at Idaho National Laboratory looked at data from a fleet of EV taxis in New York City and found that charging times increased as temperatures dropped.



The researchers found that charging times increased significantly when the weather got cold. When an EV battery

was charged at 77 degrees, a DCFC charger might charge a battery to 80 percent capacity in 30 minutes. But at 32 degrees, the battery's state of charge was 36 percent less after the same amount of time. So, the more the temperature dropped, the longer it takes to charge an EV. And the more the temperature dropped, the longer it took to charge the battery. Under the coldest conditions, the rate of charging was roughly three times slower than at warmer temperatures.

Axios reported that Tesla driver Brandon Welbourne told CBS News Chicago that a charge that should take 45 minutes was taking two hours. "I've been here for over five hours at this point and I still have not gotten to charge my car," he said. On top of that, the distance range dropped by approximately 30 percent. "Battery researchers have known about the degradation of charging efficiency under cold temperatures for a long time," said Yutaka Motoaki, an EV researcher with INL's Advanced Vehicles research group.

The EV community advises buying an expensive heat pump and having it installed at an additional expense and making other arrangements if you are travelling any distance.

Temperature problems aside, the administration uses climate control as a reason to buy electric vehicles. My 16-yearold granddaughter told me that she didn't understand how owning



an electric vehicle would help the environment. As stated earlier, charging stations use fossil fuel to power their generators. If you want to really help the climate you will need to find a charging station that uses solar or wind power.

Good luck with that. The range of an EV is under 300 miles. A typical electric car (60kWh battery) takes just under 8 hours to charge from empty-to-full with a 7kW charging point. You see more and more charging stations in parking lots of malls. Check them out the next time you see one. They are not free. It can cost from \$.30 to \$.60 per kilowatt hour. You also have the added expense of purchasing a special chord and installing a charging point in your home. Then there is the problem of replacing a battery. Electric car batteries can be expensive to replace – anywhere from \$2,500 to over \$20,000 if you have to pay for them out of pocket.

Electric Vehicles often weigh 30 percent more than gaspowered vehicles. The main reason is the weight of their batteries, which can add hundreds of pounds or more. That weight means less efficiency, longer stopping distances, more impact on collision, more road wear, and a lot of added components to accommodate the bulk.

On top of all that the components of an EV's lithium-ion batteries have to be mined, and electric car batteries aren't easily recycled, which adds to a growing worldwide e-waste problem. Finally, according to "Business Leader": "How lithium-ion batteries are sourced is a real concern for EV manufacturers because numerous materials involved in their manufacture, including iron, steel, aluminum, and copper, are sourced from China's Xinjiang Uyghur Autonomous Region. This region is particularly vulnerable to human rights violations, so this is a widespread problem the industry is currently facing,"

So, for all you people in the colder states up north, good luck with your EV and charging it, if you can find a charger that works. According to the manufacturer of my car, I can get from 420 miles in city driving to 515 miles on highway driving and it takes about 5 minutes to fill the car from empty. Thank you, but I'll keep my "efficient" gas-powered vehicle.

The following new laws passed by the Legislature and signed by Governor DeSantis in 2023 will take effect on January 1, 2024, with one exception, the "Investments in Iran" will take effect on January 10, 2024:

"Florida's Move Over Law": Adds three additional situations to the existing law requiring drivers to move over for a disabled vehicle that is stopped and displaying warning or hazard lights, emergency flares or signage; or if one or more persons are visibly present. Violators may incur a non-criminal traffic fine up to \$158.

"Back-to-School Sales Tax Holiday": The first winter "Back-to-School" sales tax holiday took place from Monday, January 1st, through Sunday, January 14th.

"Floridians First Campsite Reservations": Florida residents will have a one-month advantage over non-Floridians in reserving campsites and cabins at state parks. Floridians will be able to secure their reservation 11 months in advance, while out-of-state visitors will only be able to make reservations 10 months in advance.

"Investments in Iran": In support of Israel in its war with the Iran-funded Hamas terrorist group, the Legislature expanded on a 2007 state law that requires the State Board of Administration to divest from "scrutinized" companies with links to Iran's petroleum industry. "Under the expansion, companies will be added to the list if more than 10% of total revenues or assets are linked to Iran and involve economic sectors such as energy, manufacturing, or shipping. Companies can avoid being added to the list by demonstrating 'substantial action' to correct the issues flagged by the state."

"SunPass Frequent Traveler Program": The 50% credit for frequent travelers (35+ toll road trips monthly) using SunPass and other Florida transponders expired on December 31st.

"Local Elected Official Financial Disclosure Forms": More detailed forms similar to the forms filed by statewide elected officials and legislators will be required by Mayors and other elected municipal officials. The forms include disclosures including income, assets, and liabilities.

"Florida Business Workers' Compensation": Florida businesses will see an overall 15.1% decrease in workers' compensation insurance rates. Rate changes will vary for individual businesses.

"Florida Healthy Kids Corp.": Eligibility is expanded for the KidCare subsidized health-insurance program and establish premium tiers based on household incomes. -0-

Brevard County Schools are set to benefit from Governor DeSantis' recent announcement of more than \$35 million in funding from the Workforce Development Capitalization Incentive Grant program for the creation or expansion of semiconductor-related instructional programs for students. Florida is currently #5 in the nation for semiconductor manufacturing jobs and #3 for semiconductor facilities.

"By providing workforce education in our classrooms, students learn skills they can use to obtain high-paying jobs in growing industries like semiconductor manufacturing," DeSantis said. "This investment continues our commitment to making Florida number one for workforce education and positioning our state at the forefront of innovation."

In recognition of National Human Trafficking Prevention Month, **Attorney General Ashley Moody** has provided information on available resources and tips to help parents keep children safe from online predators and traffickers. "We have enlisted thousands of Floridians in our fight to end human trafficking. If you have not joined this vital cause yet, there is no better time to get involved than National Human Trafficking Prevention Month," Moody said. In the United States, approximately 40 percent of sex trafficking victims are recruited online. Be vigilant and safeguard your children with these actions: 1) Foster open and honest conversations with children about online activities and potential risks; 2) Teach children about the dangers of sharing personal information online and the importance of privacy settings; 3) Regularly monitor and supervise children's online interactions and the platforms they use; and 4) Emphasize the significance of reporting any suspicious or uncomfortable online encounters to a trusted adult.

Florida Commissioner of Agriculture Wilton Simpson announced the first acquisition of a permanent rural land protection easement through the Florida Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services.

The easement protects the Curren Dairy property, a 237-acre agriculture operation, in Okeechobee County through the department's Rural and Family Lands Protection Program. Rural land protection easements prevent future development of the land and allow agriculture operations to continue to contribute to Florida's economy and the production of food, timber, and other resources vital to the prosperity of Florida.

Simpson said the rural land protection easements "strengthen our food security through the protection of prime agricultural land, keep the protected property on the local tax rolls, and require every property owner to maintain the land and its natural resources according to best management practices." -0-

The Melbourne Fire Department is actively hiring for new firefighters. It describes the positions available as 'careers of a lifetime and a way to serve our community." Established over 105 years ago, the MFD has been protecting the 80,000 residents of the City of Melbourne since 1916.

Since 2022, the MFD has been designated an ISO Class 1 department, placing it among the top 1% of fire departments in the nation and the top 10% of fire departments in Florida. MFD was the first fire department in Brevard County to receive a Class 1 rating. -0-

The Florida Department of Law Enforcement announced its 2023 accomplishments, including assisting Texas law enforcement agencies investigating violent criminal activity along the Southern border; coordinating law enforcement response in the Florida Keys; and continuing monthly criminal interdictions along Florida highways. Other actions were participating in Operation Unified Front with local, state and federal law enforcement partners – resulting in the seizure of more than 17 pounds of Fentanyl, 10 pounds of methamphetamine, and 55 pounds of cocaine; and securing Florida elections by reviewing hundreds of election crime allegations involving individuals casting more than one ballot, officials charged with money laundering, and certification of false or incomplete campaign treasurer's reports and expenditures.



AN UPDATE FROM MY OFFICE By Florida 8th District State Senator Tom Wright

The commencement of the 2024 Legislative Session on January 8 marks a pivotal moment for our state. The

importance of this legislative session cannot be understated. We are at a critical juncture where the decisions we make will significantly impact Florida's economic and technological trajectory, especially in the aerospace sector. I am dedicated to ensuring that our state remains at the forefront of aerospace innovation and development.

This year, our vision is to implement policies that will strengthen Florida's position as a global hub of aerospace commerce, leading the charge in economic investment and critical infrastructure and technological advancements in the aerospace industry.

A key focus this session is on ensuring the continued success of Florida's spaceport territory, which is crucial for attracting a diverse range of aerospace companies and investors to new regions of our state. This will drive greater economic growth and support military resiliency. As a part of this focus, I introduced Senate Memorial 370, which is a significant step forward for Florida's aerospace industry.

This Memorial urges Congress to categorize spaceports as qualified for tax-exempt status under private activity bonds. The intention is to support and stimulate investment in spaceport infrastructure, which is crucial for the development of our aerospace sector. This move is aimed at bolstering both Florida's economy and its role in national aerospace endeavors. I have already successfully presented this Memorial at its first committee stop and look forward to continuing to move it forward this Legislative session.

I'd like to highlight another significant piece of legislation from the 2024 Legislative Session - Senate Bill 440. This bill, which I introduced, focuses on Utility Terrain Vehicles (UTVs). It's aimed at authorizing the operation of UTVs on certain roadways and provides a clear definition of what constitutes a "utility terrain vehicle" or UTV.

This bill is an important step towards modernizing and regulating the use of these vehicles, ensuring both their safe operation and their proper integration into our transportation system. This bill represents a key development in our state's approach to vehicle regulation and road safety, allowing individuals to register, insure and operate a vehicle that provides alternative options for our diverse communities.

The speaker at the January 3 meeting of the Brevard Federated Republican Women, Brandy Crisafulli, president and founder of Life Recaptured, said her organization's leaders have more than 28 years of combined training in human trafficking awareness and prevention. The team provides refuge and freedom to victims of sex trafficking through its Safe Home and three phase program.

Crisafulli encouraged the attendees to learn the signs of human trafficking in order to accurately alert local or federal authorities. For a victim of trafficking, she said, this may save a life.

Life Recaptured, she said, offers well informed training sessions, and also in-depth training for their safe home resident programs. It offers women who are trapped in sexual exploitation a way to refuge and freedom. They work with the community to eradicate sex trafficking through awareness, prevention, and restoration, and offer a complete approach to bringing solutions to end sex trafficking and heal survivors through physical and mental health care, case management, spiritual guidance, and mentorship.

Crisafulli said the restoration program for sex trafficking survivors is through their residential safe home, and their journey is symbolic to that of a butterfly. The butterfly enters the chrysalis, finds relief, gets renewed, and receives transformation. Their program is a life-long commitment.

Life Recaptured is working on partnering with state, local, and federal governments to successfully reach and rescue those who have been trafficked. Their future goals include a 24/7 rescue hotline that can be called any time day or night by anyone wanting help leaving "the life." After receiving the call, the Hotline Team Responder will coordinate with the Rescue Team to go pick the caller up in a safe meeting location and transport her to one of our safe homes.

Crisafulli encouraged the BFRW members to check the website <u>www.lifecaptured.org</u>, and volunteer with them to END SEX TRAFFICKING.

Some Human Trafficking Facts, she added, are that it is the 2^{nd} largest criminal activity behind drugs, which is a \$150 billion a year industry, while \$99 billion is from sexual exploitation; that Florida ranks third in the United States in human trafficking cases reported, behind only California and Texas; that in Florida, most victims are in the hospitality tourism industry, agriculture or are young girls involved in the sex trade; and that Florida's Safe Harbor Act protects anyone under the age of 18 involved in commercial sex acts.

Proof of fraud or coercion is not required. Human trafficking is defined under Florida law as the recruitment, harboring, transportation, provision, or obtaining of a person for labor or services, through the use of force fraud or coercion, Crisafulli said, and concluded that it is a zero-tolerance state for human trafficking.

The speaker for our February 7 meeting will be **Rick Lacey**, Chairman of the Brevard Republican Executive Committee. He will discuss the Brevard Republican Party's plan to win the 2024 Presidential Election, which will be "the impost important election in our lifetime."

REMEMBERING DALE YOUNG.

Republican activist and businessman **Dale Young**, who among other things founded the Ronald Reagan Club and established Trump campaign headquarters in Brevard County, following a lengthy illness passed away on December 10, one week after his 90th birthday. Young shared numerous commentaries on political issues by



email and was a past Republican State Committeeman. Interested in local government decisions and actions, he formed a group called Brevard Citizens for Better Government and served as a member of the county's Budget Committee and Board of Adjustment for many years. Born in the small farming community of Pebbles. Ohio, Young attended Oho State University and served two years in the U.S. Army, stationed in Texas with another soldier - named Elvis Presley. In business, he worked in sales and estimating, and formed his own construction company, building schools and hotels in Ohio. Moving to Melbourne, Florida, in 1986, he worked in wall and ceiling construction, and was a realtor with Young and Young Properties. In 2008, he served as president of the Melbourne Area Realtor's Association. Young was married to his wife, Beth, for 35 years, and in 2021, they retired to Jefferson County, Florida. He will be remembered for his in-depth study and knowledge of world events and will be missed.

JUSTICE PREVAILS. With the help of the Alliance Defending Freedom, justice has prevailed in Vermont for a father and his daughter who had been punished for expressing concern over a transgender student using the girls' locker

room. When Blake Allen, a 15-year-old member of the Randolph Union Middle/High School girls volleyball team, complained about it, she was suspended from school. Then, her father, Travis Allen, the school's girls' soccer coach, came to his daughter's aid, the school fired him for defending her and "misgendering" the transgender student. That is when Alliance Defending Freedom entered the picture, and following a court settlement in their favor, the Allens were awarded a \$125,000 settlement, all references to disciplinary actions were removed from their records, and they were reinstated – she as a student-athlete, and he as the soccer coach.

FOR WANT OF A SMILEY PUMPKIN FACE, A BATTLE IS BREWING. When a woman in Tampa, Florida, named Cynthia Kelly purchased a package of Reese's Peanut Butter candy, and saw that the picture of a jack-o'-lantern facade on the wrapper was not the actual shape of the candy inside, she said this was an example of false advertising. So she has filed a \$5 million class action lawsuit against the Hershey candy company, claiming "its labels for the products are materially misleading and numerous consumers have been tricked and misled by the pictures on the products' packaging. It did not contain any of the artistic carvings of the mouth or eyes as pictured on the label."

HARVARD UNIVERSITY. It was the shortest tenure as president in the school's history. Following numerous charges of plagiarism in her published scholarly writings and even her Ph.D. dissertation -- and backlash for claiming in Congressional testimony that students' anti-Semitic speech calling for genocide against Jewish people in wake of the Hamas attack against Israel did not violate university rules -- Claudine Gay resigned on January 2 as president of Harvard. She had been in the position for just six months, also serving as a professor of Government and of African and African-American Studies. Provost Alan Garber will serve as Harvard's interim president as the school searches for a successor, but ironically, it will allow Gay to remain on the teaching staff.



Addressing the Brevard chapter meeting of the Association of Mature American Citizens on January 23, **Kevin Jeffrey**, president of the

Brevard County Chapter of the Florida Republican Assembly,

spoke to the members on Preserving Freedom For The Next Generation. Jeffrey, who also is Pastor of Grace Bible Church in Titusville, firmly believes in the concept of limited government. The problem with many elected officials, he said, is that rather



than believing that laws are being enacted for the greater good, many of them feel they are being enacted for their

benefit. Local government decisions, he said, "will impact you more than what comes out of Washington." There are three things, he said, that we, the people, can do to secure freedom in our county: 1) reject the notion of political correctness; 2) redirect national issues to the local level; and 3) be independent thinkers. Jeffrey said that when people use the term "racist" against you, they are just trying to disarm you, and in response, we have to turn to "objective truth." Criticizing today's media, he said that so-called "news sources" are just opinion, and "true news stories require facts. The Florida Republican Assembly is a Judeo-Christian grassroots organization committed to restoring the Republican Party to its founding principles, and works to build legislative partnerships that introduce, reform and block legislation at the local, state and federal levels. Jeffrey noted that the late President Ronald Reagan called Republican assemblies "the Conscience of the Republican Party." Also, Jeffrey added, the assembly's goal is to "make changes one politician at a time."



In a video presentation to Florida supporters of Michigan-based Hillsdale College in Melbourne on January 9, **Dr. Roger Butters**, Associate Professor of Economics, explained why "There's Nothing Nice About Socialism." His analysis of the difference between socialism and free market economics in the video was inspired by his live lectures on the



subject in the classroom at Hillsdale. The problems with socialism, Butters said, are that it deals with collective or government ownership, and its goals are no private property or free trade, and it has government controls. This is not a new idea, he said, noting that socialism dates back to the early days of Plato in Greece, and more recently, in the Communist Manifesto of Karl Marx. It consists of promises and is full of lies, Butters said. Among other problems, he said, are that shortages are the hallmark of socialist society, and it can be destroyed by poverty. But, Butters added, the concept of socialism is popular on college campuses due to student unawareness and left-leaning professors. This is not the case, however, he said, in the free world, where economic freedom means capitalism, and the right exists to control one's own labor and property. Free markets, he added, move goods and services and solve economic problems. Even in colonial America, he said, property rights were created. Butters closed his presentation by stating that the choice between socialism and economic freedom are there for our children and grandchildren.



William Scheiner, the chief trial attorney for Brevard County, addressed the Heritage Isle Republican Club on January

4, saying he is a candidate for his office's top position – State Attorney for both Brevard and Seminole Counties – since the position will be open with the retirement of incumbent **Phil Archer**. Scheiner, who has been a prosecutor for 15 years, said this is a profession that comes with power and



consequences in decisions that are made, and it comes with great responsibility. "A prosecutor must always be prepared and diligent," he said. "To do otherwise would be a miscarriage of justice and a disservice to the community we serve." Noting that his path to becoming a prosecutor was not a traditional one, Scheiner said that in 2001, while working to pursue a degree in history with the goal of being a teacher, he was a gun crime victim, robbed and shot, but saved by the police. Scheiner added that as the Brevard State Attorney's office prosecuted his assailant, and he met police officers, lawyers and judges, and saw the system at work, he realized how it impacts so many lives, and he changed his college major – setting his sights on law school with the goal of being a prosecutor himself. He then received his undergraduate degree from UCF in legal studies and his law degree from Florida Coastal School of Law in Jacksonville in 2007. The following year he was hired to work in the Brevard County State Attorney office, and over the years has served as Misdemeanor Trial Attorney, in the Felony Trial Division, in the Sex Crimes and Child Abuse Unit, in the Career Criminal and Firearms Unit, as Felony Division Chief and as Chief Trial Attorney. Scheiner is a widower who is raising two young daughters, whom he calls his "rock and inspiration." For additional information, visit

on January 3 that her organization – which is located on college campuses throughout the United States – educates, equips and empowers women to be principled leaders for a free society. NEW had



its beginnings at her alma mater, the University of Virginia, where she told the director of the Women's Center she would like them to co-host a gathering for conservative female students, but her request was rejected. She explained that the education portion of the program covers the principles of freedom and opportunity by hosting speakers, holding debates, and providing intellectual resources to provide intellectual diversity on college campuses and in public discussions on women, policy and culture. Under equip, NEW trains pro-liberty women to serve as leaders through campus sessions, national conferences, leadership retreats, and professional development programs. And through empower, it cultivates a community of women through campus chapters, professional chapters, and an online presence to embolden participants to advocate for pro-liberty ideas in schools, workplaces, homes, and communities. Each summer, it also hosts an annual national conference in Washington, D.C. NEW is present today on more than 40 college campuses, Lips said, and as members graduate, they have become involved with professional and alumnae chapters. She is the author of "You're Not Alone: The Conservative Woman's Guide to College," which focuses on such topics as picking a college major, for student government, running building a community, and how conservative young women can thrive in this environment. --Freshman Florida Democrat Congressman Maxwell Frost of

Orlando, for not only claiming that protecting the nation's southern border is "bigoted," but also proposing legislation to remove the Statue of Liberty from New York, claiming that it is "America's largest symbol that tells people to come here." Does he not know the difference between "illegal" and "legal" immigration?

--Ohio Republican Governor Mike DeWine, for vetoing legislation passed by the state General Assembly to ban gender procedures on minors and prevent boys from competing in girls' sports in the state. The veto faced an override by Ohio's Republican legislative supermajority. But in a special session of the legislature, the House voted 65-28 to reject DeWine's attempt to kill the SAFE Act, and later the Ohio Senate voted 23-9 to overturn the veto.

--New York Democrat Governor Kathy Hochul, for announcing a new budget proposal to increase funding for illegal aliens in the state and offset it by cutting funding for 44 school districts – which ironically are located in conservative areas.
