Former President Trump defeated Democrat Vice President Kamala Harris following a comeback roller-coaster campaign during which he was indicted four times, criminally convicted, and survived two assassination attempts. He told supporters that "This will truly be a golden age of America, which has given us an unprecedented and powerful mandate. Now, it's time to put the divisions of the past four years behind us. It's time to unite. I will govern by a simple motto: Promises Made; Promises Kept."

Throughout Florida, there were six state constitutional amendments on the ballot, all of them needing 60 percent of the votes cast to take effect. Only two did – one concerning the right to fish and hunt in the state, and one involving adjustment to the value of homestead exemptions. Two controversial amendments which the Republican Party fought tooth-and-nail, did not pass. These two would have allowed rampant abortions to take place and recreational marijuana to be made available.

Also on Florida ballots were 28 races for seats in the U.S. House of Representatives – currently held by 20 Republicans and 8 Democrats. There were no changes, since 19 of the

Republicans won re-election, and even though 8th District Congressman Bill Posey retired, the party retained his seat, which was captured by former State Senate Majority Leader Mike Haridopolis.

And throughout the United States, it was a Republican trifecta, taking the Presidency, the U.S. Senate and the House of Representatives – although in the House there were still a few undeclared seat winners as ballots were still being counted.

MRC CRUISE CELEBRATES 2024 ELECTION VICTORIES By Space Coast Tusk Editor Stuart Gorin

More than 150 supporters of the Media Research Center from throughout the United States spent a joyful week cruising the Caribbean November 10-17 aboard Holland America's Nieuw Amsterdam, as political experts discussed with them the results of the 2024 election, and what they mean for Conservatives and Republicans.

As the ship departed Fort Lauderdale, Florida, for ports in Nassau, St. Thomas, San Juan, and Grand Turk, the group members were able to visit all of the islands, but had numerous private lectures during the times the vessel was at sea.

MRC President Brent Bozell, who founded the organization in 1987 as America's premier media watchdog to expose and neutralize the Left's propaganda in the national news media, welcomed the group aboard, noting that the organization's mission is to document and combat the falsehoods and censorship of the news media, entertainment media and Big Tech, in order to defend and preserve America's founding principles and Judeo-Christian values.

He said that originally Conservatives had no way to communicate, and needed to break the left's monopoly, but the MRC's success in documenting the leftist bias has now resulted in a historically low 32 percent of Americans who now say they trust media to be fair and impartial. Through its advanced news monitoring, the center educates the public on the issues by generating an average of 515 million weekly impressions across radio, television, social media, email and websites.

"More recently," Bozell said, "the media did not cover the Hunter Biden laptop story, and that would have made a difference in the 2020 election. And since 2008, Google has interfered in elections 41 times, and Facebook, 39 times."

Concerning transgender men in women's sports and bathrooms, he said, now that the facts are out in the open, they are opposed by two-thirds of the voters.

Speakers who traveled with the group, and joined attendees at dinner tables, were:



Syndicated columnist **Cal Thomas**, who said the way to reclaim America's next generation in the education field is through school choice.

Fox News contributor **Sara Carter**, discussing undocumented illegals, said they are changing our children's culture by moving them to a global mindset, and we have to expose these scoundrels.

Washington Times writer **Charlie Hurt** said President Trump's top priorities should be securing the boarder, removing the illegals, and unleashing American prosperity through oil drilling and lowering gas prices.

Fox News columnist **Joe Concha** said Elon Musk is "changing the world" through his purchase of Twitter, now called X, because it is number one in the market and involves free speech.

Retired Utah Congressman Jason Chaffetz, speaking of his "dream ticket" for 2028, said it would be Vice President J.D. Vance at the top, and Arkansas Governor Sarah Huckabee Sanders as vice president.

Actor and actress **Kevin** and **Sam Sorbo** spoke about the war in Hollywood between Christians and ideologues and being victims of "cancel culture."

MRC Vice President Dan Schneider said that while the United States has given the world freedom and provided how people can govern themselves, under the Biden Administration there was chaos and censorship, which is the greatest threat there is to democracy.

ForAmerica President David Bozell noted that Trump's selection of **Susie Wiles** as White House Chief of Staff, and **Stephen Miller** as one of the deputies "will work well together."

"Newsbusters" Executive Editor Tim Graham served as moderator for several of the panel discussions throughout the cruise.

HARIDOPOLIS READY TO WORK IN CONGRESS FOR CONSTITUENTS



Mike Haridopolis, Florida's 8th District Congressman-elect, invited Brevard County voters to a post-election party in Melbourne to celebrate the election results the evening of November 5, and said he is "really excited" about the results, and is "ready to get to work" in Washington.

He said his top initial priorities as

a congressman will be working to "secure the borders" against illegal immigration, and to "make America more affordable." He said he will aim to drive down oil prices and to"reduce out-of-control government spending."

"I am honored to serve as the next congressman for District 8," Haridopolos said. 'Thank you to the voters, to our volunteers and to our supporters for your trust and confidence. The voters spoke loud and clear in this election. They want a congressman who will make America affordable again, stop illegal immigration and get government spending under control. I will work every day to do just that. And I'll work to end partisan gridlock in Congress to get things done."

Haridopolos said he is proud that "we ran a positive campaign. We talked about ideas and solutions, and we didn't get into the mud," Joining him at the party were retiring **Congressman Bill Posey** and his wife, Katie, and Haridopolos thanked them for their service to the community.

"I was honored to have Congressman Posey's complete

endorsement, and I pledge to carry on his legacy of service and conservative leadership," Haridopolos said. "I have big, big shoes to fill."

Also at the party was **Palm Bay Mayor Rob Medina**, a Republican who won re-election in a municipal nonpartisan race. He led the crowd in chanting "USA!" before introducing Haridopolis and Posey, saying: "What an outstanding evening. We're expecting great things for this country. Remember: God is not done with the United States of America. There's so much excitement. Can you feel it?"



POLITICAL JOTTINGS AND DOTTINGS

President Trump rode to his rally in Green Bay, Wisconsin, in a garbage truck decorated with Trump campaign logos. His clever mode of transportation threw a bit of shade on

Joe Biden and Kamala Harris – one day after the president said that Trump supporters were "garbage." Wearing an orange safety vest, Trump asked reporters "How do you like my garbage truck?" while sitting in the passenger seat of the MAGA-adorned garbage truck cruising around the tarmac. "This truck is in honor of Kamala and Joe Biden." -0-

--Prior to the election, New York Democrat Governor Kathy Hochul said on television that New York voters who support Donald Trump are "anti-women, anti-abortion and anti-American." Podcaster Todd Starnes retorted that "voters should not be bullied or intimidated by Democrats of the Drive By Media. Don't believe any polling data or negative stories about President Trump. They are trying to discourage you from voting on Election Day. They want to shame you. That's why the Democrats have been calling Trump supporters Nazis, racists, white supremacists, garbage and now anti-Americans."

--During the early voting period, Republican Party officials had "Georgia on their mind," as four counties – Fulton, Cobb, DeKalb and Gwinnett – decided to extend election office hours and accept absentee ballots beyond the legally designated period. It sparked accusations of election law violations and led to a lawsuit filed by the Republican National Committee. RNC Chairman Michael Whatley said Republican poll watchers were initially barred from observing the ballot intake process in these counties. -0-

--In Hubbard County, Minnesota, Timothy Scouton, who served as the head election judge for the Badoura Township Precinct, has been arrested for accepting 2024 ballots from unregistered voters and neglecting his duties as an election official. The felonies cast a spotlight on adherence to electoral laws and raised questions about election integrity. -0--In Iowa, pollster Ann Selzer once had the reputation for accurate predictions. But 2024 happened -- and she announced that her polling ensured presidential victory for Democrat Kamala Harris. So after Republican Donald Trump turned that around by double digits – Selzer suddenly retired from the polling business.



The word "Democracy" is often used to describe the form of government we have in the United States. It is used so freely that most people don't know or have not heard that we are a Representative

"Republic" and not a Democracy.

A Republic is defined by Britannica as a form of government in which a state is ruled by representatives of the citizen body. In a republic, elected representatives create laws that must comply with a constitution that protects minority rights. The word "republic" comes from the Latin phrase "res publica," which means "a matter of the people."



A Democracy, on the other hand, is a government where the people have the power to make decisions directly or, in other words, "mob rule." It is a form of government where the power is vested in the people and exercised by them by a direct vote where all that

is needed to determine issues is given by a simple majority of the people's vote.

This is the mantra of the losing side of any election. So why isn't it our form of government? I know numbers could make your eyes cross, so I'll keep it simple, but still as accurate as the figures show. The United States had 168 million registered voters in 2024. Of those in order largest to smallest state considered to be solid blue are:

Washington 6.1 million
Massachusetts 5.7 million
Oregon 3.4 million
Maryland 3.4 million
Colorado 3 million
Nevada 1.5 million

For a total of 74.1million. Not included are smaller "blue states" like Rhode Island, Delaware, Hawaii and D.C. That is more than enough to allow these states to control the outcome of a national election. These numbers indicate that there would be a total of roughly 100 million voters remaining in the rest of the nation. Although not all the registered voters would vote Democrat, nor all of the remaining would vote Republican, but I for one would not want to stake a national election on these odds.

One of the ways that the Framers of the Constitution tried to discourage the government from becoming a Democracy was by selecting the nation's chief executive through the use of an Electoral College, rather than through direct democratic election. In other words, we are a Representative Republic, not a Democracy, as many people think.

The Electoral College was established in 1788 by Article II of the U.S. Constitution. It is not specifically mentioned but came about as a compromise by the Founding Fathers. The decision to form such a system came about as a compromise. One proposal was to have a simple majority by the citizens. However, the first Presidential election voters had to be white male landowners over the age of 21. States were given the power to regulate their own voting laws and, in some states, Catholics, Jews, and Quakers were barred from voting. Some states like New Jersey specifically barred women from voting. In 1790, The Naturalization law is passed. Only free, white immigrants can become citizens. It wasn't until 1787 that the Constitutional Convention decided on a method to elect an elected executive and not a king would be chosen for a 4-year term.

Other forms of election were heatedly debated, including election by the United States Congress. The Congress would vote for President and the runner up would be Vice-President. There were at least 3 proposals made as to what system would be used for Presidential elections. The Framers feared Democracy and worried that citizens, who were largely uneducated and illiterate, would fall prey to politicians who would appeal to the desires and prejudices of ordinary people rather than by using rational argument.

According to George Mason University School of Public Policy, "deliberation of the Framers over the summer of 1787 to make the case that the main motivation for adoption of the Electoral College was the need to remove selection from the legislature and at the same time to ensure that the less populous and slave-holding states could preserve the advantage they won through the Connecticut compromise."

The primary impediment to popular elections concerned the uneven distribution of population among the states and the counting of slaves for purposes of presidential election. While the north wanted only "free" people to be allowed, the south wanted to inflate their numbers by including slaves.


In 1787, the compromise to select members of the House of Representatives, which would then determine the number of "Electors," would be based on the state's free population plus three fifths of its slaves which became known as the Connecticut Compromise or Three Fifths Compromise.

The choices were a "democratic' vote of the citizens as defined in the Connecticut Compromise, election by the House of Representatives whose numbers were determined by the population of states, and the Electoral College.

The danger today is the same as during the time of the Framers. In a popular vote, as shown earlier, would control

the outcome of elections. In order to protect lesser populated states, the number of Electors equals the number of Representatives in each state plus the 2 Senators of each state. Florida, having 28 members of the House plus 2 Senators, would give that state 30 Electors. Georgia, where I reside, has 14 plus 2 giving it 16 Electors.

Thank you, Framers, for finding a way to protect all states rights and give each state, no matter the size, a voice in electing the most powerful position in the world.

The Florida Legislature has held its Organization Session in Tallahassee, and I was officially sworn in as your State Representative. We also elected **Speaker Designate Daniel Perez** as our Speaker for the 2024-2026 term and **Representative Wyman Duggan** as our Speaker protempore. We adopted the House rules, and appointed **Jeff Takacs** as the Clerk of the House and **Russell Hosford** as our Sergeant at Arms.

During the Organization Session, Speaker Perez addressed the chamber, declaring that "We aren't a debate society, and we shouldn't be the House of Talk. We should be the House of Action".

- Urgent Payment Demands: Scammers often claim that immediate payment is necessary to prevent disconnection.
- Unusual Payment Requests: Requests for gift cards, prepaid debit cards or cryptocurrency are common red flags.
- Spoofed Caller IDs: Scammers may manipulate caller IDs to make it appear as if a call is from a utility company; and
- False Refunds: Bad actors may promise false refunds, free products or services but have stipulations hidden in a contract.

The Melbourne City Council has approved Northrop Grumman's request to build their new expansion. This project consists of a 300,000 square foot office building and a 17,000 square foot bay building.

The new facilities will join several other defense contractors in the Industrial Zone near the Melbourne Orlando International Airport. The planned expansion of Northrop Grumman's business operations will create more than 1000 jobs to the community. -0-

<u>SelectFlorida's</u> mission to Italy, has successfully achieved one of its key goals. The delegation has announced an international trade development office will be established next year in the city of Viareggio.

This office will serve as a conduit for Italian businesses who wish to conduct business in Florida. Currently, Florida has similar trade development offices in 16 nations. Commerce Secretary Alex Kelly has indicated the potential for collaboration in the maritime industry, given that shipbuilding is a field in which both Italy and Florida excel. -0-

Students at the Coastal Community School in Satellite Beach had the unique opportunity to communicate directly with Astronaut Sunita (Suni) Williams, who is currently on the International Space Station. The ISS is traveling at over 17,500 miles per hour and the students were able to interact with Suni Williams via a HAM radio call as the space station passed over Florida.

This rare opportunity to talk live to an astronaut on the space station was facilitated by CCS Principal Jennifer Elling. Twelve students had the chance to ask questions of Ms. Williams while the entire student body was able to listen to the exchange in real time on campus.

Astronauts Suni Williams and Butch Wilmore had flown to the ISS on the Boeing Starliner's crewed flight test in June for an eight-day mission. Due to concerns about Starliner's thruster performance they have been unable to return. They are now scheduled to return to Earth on the Crew-9 SpaceX Dragon in February 2025.

Trettis briefed us on Republican victories around the country, state and county, saying that stopping Amendments 3 and 4 (marijuana and abortion) on the ballot was more important than we thought. He explained that these amendments were not grassroots, concerned citizen petitions. Amendments 3 and 4 were written, promoted and financed by out of state



groups seeking to advance their own self interests.

Given the potential for abuse in our current system, Trettis suggested that our legislature consider:

-- Requiring a 66.66 percent vote for passing citizen petitions.

-- Restricting citizen petitions to issues related to the structure of government and prohibiting those that are legislative in nature.

Trettis said that while the Amendment which would have allowed partisan School Board races did not pass, a federal judge recently ruled prohibiting School Board candidates from disclosing their political affiliation was unconstitutional. School Board candidates may now advertise their party affiliation.

He said that Donald Trump's victory was powered by Republicans like us, those who do the hard work, that raise the money, knock the doors, make the phone calls, and convince their friends and neighbors to vote Republican. It was also powered by a coalition of people who want the same thing we have always wanted, prosperity, security, safety, good education and rejection of wokeness, false DEI initiatives and transgenderism.

Trettis also joked that getting Elon Musk in exchange for Liz Cheney was the best political trade in history!

MOMS FOR LIBERTY MEETS IN VIERA

Palm Bay Councilmanelect Chandler Langevin

addressed the Moms For Liberty meeting in Viera on November 11, and in honor of Veteran's Day, he spoke about his nearly 11-year career as a U.S. Navy Hospital Corpsman, during which he was attached to the Marine Corps infantry and the 4th Air Naval Gunfire Liaison Company.

Langevin, who was deployed to Afghanistan and the Pacific Theatre, received a Naval Commendation Medal for lifesaving actions while on tour. As a seventh generation Floridian, he said he can trace his family's history of service back to the American Revolution, and service is "in his blood."



After returning from Afghanistan, Langevin said he works in Veteran Advocacy, founded the local Florida Scouts youth program, and serves on the Board of Directors at Odyssey Charter School. He also discussed the current state of the military, how veterans are treated, and what may change under the new Trump administration.



Grover Norquist, the president and founder of Americans For Tax Reform, told the Leadership Institute's Wednesday Wake Up Breakfast attendees on November 6 that if the Democrats had won the 2024 election, they would have changed the rules in the country regarding union dues – forcing them

on more workers.

Instead, he said, these workers will be getting President Trump's promised tax cuts. He said the nation will be enjoying "free market, limited government legislation." Norquist's organization opposes all tax increases, and in 1994, it created a pledge for all candidates for political office to sign that they would



never raise taxes. He said that 96 percent of the candidates that year did sign it.

This Taxpayer Protection opposes increases in marginal income tax rates for individuals and businesses, and net reductions or eliminations of deductions and credits without a matching reduced tax rate. But politicians often run for office saying they won't raise tases, and then quickly turn their backs on the taxpayer, so the idea of the Pledge is to make them put their no-new-taxes rhetoric in writing.

Noting that higher taxes are always part of the Democrat Party's agenda, Norquist pointed out that from 1932 to 1994, there were only two terms in which Republicans controlled Congress. Today, he said, there are seven states that have no state income tax for their residents, and 10 additional states are considering such a move.

The Heritage Foundation President Kevin Roberts, adapted from writing on Populist Conservatism and Constitutional Order in Hillsdale College's publication "Imprimis":

"The top-down, elitist brand of politics that has dominated the United States

since the end of the Cold War - under Republican and Democratic administrations alike - has failed. Yes, we are materially richer than we were in 1991, and our largest corporations are more profitable. But we are militarily and strategically weaker, fiscally endangered, and spiritually enervated. As a result, public trust in the vaunted institutions that our elites control-political, scientific, journalistic, educational, religious - has evaporated. And populism especially on the conservative Right – is on the rise. Although I will focus on the U.S., this rise of populism is widespread. From Argentina to Italy to France to the United Kingdom to Hungary, there are similarities. The new populism tends to be economically and politically nationalistic. It tends to be culturally patriotic and socially conservative. It tends to sympathize with workers over corporations. It is also selfconsciously, defiantly - often mockingly - antiestablishment.... With few exceptions, the Left as we know it today has rejected populism out of hand, embracing instead Big Government, Big Business, Big Banks, Big Tech, Big Pharma, Big Labor, Big Ag, Big Media, and Big Entertainment. For the most part, today's Left is hard at work fortifying the power these institutions wield against the rigors of democratic accountability. Thus, the only hope for a sustainable, democratically legitimate populist reform movement today is on the Right. The question is whether the leaders of the movement can harness the highly negative energy from which the populism emerges and channel it toward a coherent, positive politics of national renewal and reform.... Despite being discredited, the elites do offer a critique of populism that deserves to be taken seriously: the claim that populism is all style, lacks substance, and cannot be trusted. Populism, according to this view, is a rhetorical Trojan Horse that unprincipled demagogues use to advance

their narrow, selfish ambitions. And to be sure, history is full of corrupt tribunes of the people who abuse their power and enrich themselves at their nation's expense. The lesson to be drawn from this critique is that legitimate and enduring change in democracies comes neither from philosophers nor rabble-rousers. It only comes by strategically fusing populist energy and principled ideas.... None of our problems are beyond our constitutional order's power to solve. What is it we need, after all? We need a Congress that acts like a legislature rather than a company of moralizing performance artists. We need a president who acts like a responsible chief executive rather than a drunken king. We need a judiciary that acts impartially in accordance with the Constitution and the laws of the land rather than in a partisan manner. And we need to disperse the political power that is now concentrated in the hands of the Washington establishment.... American conservatism exists to serve the people and the nation through the Constitution. This includes defending them against enemies foreign and domestic. And the fact is, elite institutions have become the people's and the nation's enemies. They are openly waging cultural war on those they ostensibly serve. They cannot be negotiated with or accommodated. They must be defunded, disbanded, and disempowered. The rewards for doing so - for putting American families first again - will be greater than we can know. This is the fight before us. If we thoughtfully and tenaciously combine populist energy with conservative principles, it is а fight can win." we



Journalist **Charles C.W. Cooke**, writing on the United States Surgeon General Vivek Murthy thinking that gun ownership is a disease, in "America's 1st Freedom" and gun "violence is a publichealth crisis in our country":

"One of the more pernicious beliefs within contemporary American politics is there are certain words or phrases that, if uttered by the right person at the right time, can bypass the usual constitutional processes and deliver absolute victory to the speaker. Surgeon General Vivek Murthy offered up a stellar example of this conviction when he issued a 40-page report that he framed with the claim that 'gun violence is a public health crisis in our country and requires a public health solution'....When one digs in a little further, one can see that it is not only inept, but is downright sinister. 'Gun violence' which in practice involves criminals abusing firearms simply cannot be a 'public health issue' in the way that, say, the spread of HIV was in the 1980s. Rather, it is a complex criminal matter that requires a robust response from our legislatures, police and courts, as well as from the general public. To pathologize that issue, as Murthy is trying to do, not only makes that robust response impossible to achieve, but also guarantees that the focus will be placed on the wrong villain: the law-abiding citizens who are not the problem, instead of the criminal class that is. As a means of doing politics, Murthy's approach is even worse. As we learned during the COVID-19 pandemic, when political figures start talking in this manner, they invariably end up insisting

dogmatically that their personal opinions are the equivalent of 'science' or 'medicine' or 'logic,' and that anyone who disagrees with them is thus attacking modernity, per se. But Murthy's views are not 'science,' rather they are politics of the sort that one would expect to find in every other department of the White House. Indeed, what Murthy repeatedly describes as 'a public health solution' is, in fact, nothing more than the existing laundry list of gun-control proposals that his boss, President Joe Biden, has been on record desiring for years....Thanks to the Second Amendment and its 45 state-level equivalents, the right to keep and bear firearms is protected in a way that does not apply to toasters or swimming pools or lawnmowers. Uttering the words 'public health solution' does not change this. Predictably, Murphy's report is full of mistakes. Most egregiously, he repeats the lie that firearms are the number-one cause of death for children - which is true only if one includes 18- and 19year-old gang members in the definition. But then he would, because he's not engaged in medicine, he's engaged in propaganda."

American Security Council Foundation Senior Analyst Laurence F. Sanford, writing on Bigger BRICS in Russia in his "Peace Through Strength" publication:

"BRICS is a consortium of countries led by China that seeks to build alternatives to the dominance of Western institutions such as the World Bank, Group of Seven, and the U.N. Security Council. BRICS is the



acronym of the founding countries: Brazil, Russia, India, China, and South Africa. BRICS met in Kazan, Russia, on October 22 for a three-day conference hosted by Russian President Vladimir Putin. Thirty-six countries, including twenty heads of state, attended. Putin held 20 bilateral meetings with attendees, including Chinese President Xi, Indian Prime Minister Modi, and South African President Ramaphosa. President Lula of Brazil did not attend due to health issues. BRICS is now BRICS+ as it expanded its membership to include Egypt, Ethiopia, Iran, Saudi Arabia, and the United Arab Emirates (UAE). Argentina was invited to join but declined because its new president, Javier Milei, proclaimed full alignment with the 'free nations of the West.' Saudi Arabia has not officially acknowledged membership. In 2023, the 10 BRICS+ members invited 13 nations to join as 'partners' with no voting rights: Turkey, Indonesia, Algeria, Belarus, Cuba, Bolivia, Malaysia, Uzbekistan, Kazakhstan, Thailand, Vietnam, Nigeria, and Uganda. Venezuela was absent from the new partner list because President Lula of Brazil was upset by Venezuela's lack of supporting public data verifying President Maduro's recent election. The U.S. dollar's dominance as the world's reserve and trade currency gives America an outsized influence over the global finance system. Most of the world's trade is conducted in the U.S. dollar. This allows the United States to impose economic sanctions against countries such as Russia, China, North Korea, and Iran, BRICS+ wants to weaken the dollar to reduce U.S. influence and promote trade in local currencies. China is

advocating for the use of its renminbi currency as an alternative to the dollar. African participation in the 2024 BRICS+ demonstrated African interest in the bloc's economic opportunities, rather than becoming embroiled in geopolitics. Some are wary of China's influence, representing 60 % of the bloc's gross national products. Egypt, Ethiopia, and South Africa touted new economic cooperation with Russia and China. BRICS+ annual declaration focused on the threat of climate change, the economic toll on member states of economic sanctions. and controlling misinformation. Ironically, the report's authors include the world's worst polluters and media censors (China and India). The report failed to condemn Russia's war against Ukraine and China's committing genocide against its Muslim Uyghur citizens. BRICS+ is seeking changes in the U.N. Security Council to include India, Japan, Brazil, and Germany as permanent members and to expand non-permanent memberships to more African countries.... The United States should:1. Treat others as they are treating America. If a country is conducting actions that are not friendly, then reciprocate. 2. Increase gray zone actions promoting American values via media outreach, covert actions, and diplomacy. 3. Strengthen existing alliances by eliminating countries not sharing the alliance ethos (e.g., Turkey out of NATO). 4. Promote Judeo-Christian values of an individual's worth (human rights). 5. Increase the U.S. defense budget and supporting infrastructure."



The late economics writer **Henry Hazlitt** wrote on "The Dangers of Price Controls" for the very first issue of Hillsdale College's "Imprimis" publication in May 1972, and the article was updated in September of this year by First Trust chief economist **Brian Wesbury:**

"The first thing to be said about price and wage fixing is

that it is harmful at any time and under any condition. It is a giant step toward a dictated, regimented, and authoritarian economy. It makes impossible arrangements that both sides are willing to agree to. It sets aside contracts that have already been made in good faith.... Since the onset of Covid, government

deficits have soared to spectacular levels. Roughly \$5 trillion of new debt was issued to pay people not to work and to buy vaccines, as well as to fund Green New Deal policies. The massive spending bills that accomplished this were cynically called the "CARES Act" and comically, the "Inflations Reduction Act." Even in the past two years, with the pandemic over and the unemployment rate down near four percent, the government – in adopting what may be the most irresponsible budgets in U.S. history – has been running deficits as high as \$2 trillion. These deficits have mostly been financed by the Fed's creation of new money....Sometimes people talk as if it would be possible to have universal price fixing, While

nobody knows how many separate prices and wages there are, there are good reasons for thinking that there cannot be fewer than about ten million. If you try to fix ten million prices, what you are trying to fix is something on the order of 50 trillion cross-relationships of prices. This is something that no government is capable of determining - or policing....Who knows what bureaucratic nightmare would arise from an attempt to fix prices today. Even more than in the 1970's, bureaucrats today act as if they are omnipotent and untouchable...In a free market system, wages tend to rise faster than prices over time. Why? Because workers become more productive. We often measure this in terms of so-called man-hour productivity. But there are two false assumptions that go into measuring it that way. One false assumption is that it is simply labor productivity; the other is that the increase occurs automatically. We would get a much better idea of what we are talking about if, instead of speaking of man-hour productivity, we spoke of man-machine-hour productivity or labor-capital productivity....What the government ought to be doing to counter inflation and get prices low is to free and encourage the producers – not to put them in a straitjacket by fixing prices....Under the auspices of 'crisis management,' the Federal Reserve has added 60 percent to the money supply and increased its balance sheet by 85 percent in just 16 years. The Federal Reserve was founded in 1913. In the 95 years between then and 2008, just 40 percent of the money supply was created. In the subsequent 16 years, between 2008 and 2024, we have almost tripled the money supply. No wonder inflation is a problem."
